	Follow the footpath out of the far end of the Close and turn left into Glebe Avenue.	
Q5	Which tree are you Close to?	Willow (tree Close)
Q6	Where can you go from here by public transport?	Uxbridge or Baker Street
	Turn left down the steps towards the Compass.	
Q7	Ickenham Hall has a newly planted herb garden. Can you name 3 different plants?	Rosemary, Thyme, Lavender, Box, Escallonia
Q8	In whose memories have the roses been planted?	Chris Holland, Pam Marchant, Joyce Cartmell
	Follow the stepping stones across the lawn and turn right and walk around the building.	
Q9	What is the largest tree in the parkland?	Horse chestnut
Q10	How is money being raised to restore Ickenham Hall?	Book sale
Q11	What show is being advertised on the poster to the left of the main entrance to the Compass Theatre?	Lettice and Lovage (The Boy Friend at end of June)

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Q12	Turn left out of car park. Which boy lives in the Drive?	Lawrence (Drive)
	<i>Short route: turn right, cross back over bridge and go to question 29. Long route: cross Crosier Road.</i>	
Q13	When could you see the manor from the villas?	1900 Manorview Villas built
Q14	<i>Turn left into St Giles Avenue.</i> What else in Ickenham is named St Giles?	Church
Q15	What can't you do on the grassy area on the right?	No ball games
	<i>Turn left into Austin's Lane.</i>	
Q16	What animals are on the doorstep of Number 17?	elephants
Q17	Which route is signposted here?	Hillingdon Trail
Q18	<i>Walk carefully along the road and turn left by the red bin.</i> What must be put in this bin?	Dog poo
	<i>Walk along the left side of the field and follow the footpath in the corner to Lawrence Drive. Turn right</i>	
Q19	6 blue _____ at number 80?	Flower pots
Q20	<i>Go up steps & turn right over the bridge. Cross road & turn left.</i> This Scottish city has a festival too!	Edinburgh
Q22	How much can you be fined for dropping litter?	£80
Q23	Whose head at number 68?	Horse
Q24	<i>Turn right.</i> What may have grazed here?	Horse, cattle etc (Paddock)
Q25	How many trees on the verges along this road? <i>Turn right at end of road.</i>	11
Q27	Which small mammals are in the porch of number 25?	Hedgehog and rabbit
Q28	Which silent movie star may have eaten here? <i>Cross Glebe Avenue and go to question 31.</i>	(Charlie) Chaplin
Q29	This Scottish city has a festival too!	Edinburgh
Q30	Where can you buy fresh baked bread?	Iced and Sliced
Q31	When is the library open on Thursdays?	9:30am – 7pm
